Dear Parents,

Havelock High School continues to strive to be one of the highest performing high schools in North Carolina. Since the fall of 2012 we have been implementing new standards and adhering to new state-mandated assessment processes. We have yet to reach the level that we maintained prior to the curriculum changes; however, our results are showing steady improvement as we implement the new curriculum and administer the new assessments.

North Carolina has modified the accountability system that is used to evaluate school performance. There are now five elements that the state considers when measuring school success. They are as follows:

- Performance Composite-The percent of students scoring at a proficient level on the current three EOC tests.
- Math Rigor-The percentage of four year cohort graduates who take and pass Algebra 2/Integrated Math 3
- Graduation Cohort Rate-The percent of students who graduate in four years
- WorkKeys-The percent of seniors who are CTE concentrators who achieve a Silver Certificate or better on the WorkKeys
 assessment
- ACT-The average sum of the five sub-tests across the school compared to the sum of the college-ready benchmarks

Student growth also contributes to the overall evaluation of schools in the new model. As we continue to implement new state and federal curriculums, the teaching methods and course offerings at Havelock High School continue to evolve. In addition, we have increased our Advanced Placement offerings to include English III, English IV, Government, United States History, Biology, Earth and Environmental Sciences, and Calculus. We intend to add AP Psychology during the 2014-2015 school year.

Our teachers and staff do everything that they can to inspire and assist students so that they can be successful. In my opinion, the following strategies have had a positive affect on our results: monitoring student attendance, the assiduous work ethic of our students and faculty, and the seminar program. The ACT college admission test will be administered for all juniors in March.

I would like to congratulate the 2013 Havelock High School Ram Football team and coaching staff for their 16-0 season and for winning the 3A State Championship for the third year in a row. I would also like to congratulate Coach Jim Bob Bryant for being chosen as the North Carolina Associated Press Coach of the Year for the second time in three years. I appreciate the recognition for our team by the Craven County School Board, the Craven County Board of Commissioners and the Board of Commissioners of the City of Havelock.

We are still collecting donations to help defray the costs of championship rings and other athletic needs. We are short of our goal. If you would like to donate money this cause, call 444-5112, come by the school or you can mail your donation.

Our men's basketball team is currently undefeated in the Coastal 3A Conference. I am proud of all of our basketball teams and our swimming team. The wrestlers are experiencing success and are poised to make a run for the tournament championship. All of our winter sports are having successful seasons, and I anticipate participants in district and state tournaments and playoffs. Havelock High School will be hosting the Coastal 3A Conference Cheerleading Competition this Saturday at 12:30 P. M.

The Havelock High School Music Department will be hosting the North Carolina Music Educators Association Large Choral Festival on March 7, 2014 and the North Carolina Bandmasters Association Eastern District Music Performance Assessment on March 26-27, 2014. All performances will be held in the Havelock Performing Arts Center and are free to the public. SCHEDULING FOR 2014-2015 TO BEGIN IN MARCH

The Havelock High School counseling office is already making plans for the 2014-2015 school year.

Counselors will begin meeting with underclassmen at HHS on March 3rd during scheduled times to individually discuss progress toward graduation, post-graduation plans and next year's course selections. Students will receive a course selection sheet for parents to review and sign.

The process is expected to take several weeks, and then counselors will begin meeting with up-

coming freshmen at their schools.

Prior to the meetings, students will receive information about accessing the district curriculum bulletin, and parents are encouraged to be involved in assisting students in making course decisions.

Updated offerings at HHS include more Advanced Placement options, and two courses in United States History are now required for students beginning with the Class of 2016.

JUNIORS TO TAKE THE ACT

On Tuesday, March 4, 2014, the ACT College Admissions Assessment will be administered to all juniors in North Carolina. This assessment is part of the state's academic performance data collection process.

The test is administered free of charge, and students will be given the opportunity to submit results to colleges they are interested in attending for admission purposes. Therefore, all juniors are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity.

In an effort to assist students in preparing for this test, which includes subtests in Reading, Writing, English, Math and Science, Havelock High School will be offering preparation sessions during the school day in the two weeks prior to the test. Additionally, students are encouraged to use online preparation tools and their ACT PLAN results from last year to get ready for the test. Links to preparation materials can be found on the school's website.

Release of 2012-2013 School Report Cards

The North Carolina Department of Public Instruction has scheduled the public release of the 2012-2013 NC Report Cards for Tuesday, January 28th. This data will include results from several areas including school profile information, student performance data, safety and staffing.

The student performance data reflects the state's new accountability model which focuses on the nationally-recognized Common Core curriculum standards in English and math, the NC Essential Standards for science and social studies and the continued focus on students meeting UNC system admission requirements as well as additional standards related to career readiness.
